Family Faith Formation – JUNE 20th

Theme: The cross is a way of life for Jesus' followers.

Listen to the Word: As you hear this reading, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart? What lingers in your memory?

Question for Children: Jesus asks us to follow him. What does that mean to you? What cross is Jesus asking you to carry at this time in your life? How does Jesus help you carry it?

Question for Youth: What do the following statements mean to you: Deny your self; take up your cross daily; follow Jesus; lose your life to save it? When did Jesus become more than just a name in the Bible for you?

Question for Adults: How would you describe the cross you bear? How does Jesus help you carry it? How was the expectation of a Messiah different from the Messiah that Jesus actually represented? Why do you think Jesus needed to be a suffering servant Messiah?
